



Management of Natura 2000 sites in Central and Eastern Europe

EUROPARC CEE workshop

3-5 May, 2017, Fertőújlak, Hungary

Designation of Natura 2000 sites in countries of the East and Central European region was done more than 10 years ago. The relatively long time passed since then enables us to evaluate the process of designation and actions done for the conservation of Natura 2000 values.

Between 3-5 May 2017 Europarc CEE and the Fertő-Hanság National Park Directorate (Hungary) organise a workshop to review the management of Natura 2000 sites and summarize experiences.



Main topics discussed:

- Implementation of Natura 2000 in different countries
- Preparation of management plans for N2k and their harmonization with management plans for nationally designated areas, main challenges of the process and current state of the play
- EU agricultural subsidies vs. Natura 2000 aims

Csapody István Nature School, Fertőújlak, Hungary

Accomodation

The building bearing the name of Dr. István Csapody, engineer of forestry and botanist was opened in May 2007. Surrounded by the protected areas, on the border of the settlement Fertőújlak the building once was a base of border guards. Recently it is a multifunctional visitor center including accommodation facilities that has the aim to satisfy the needs of visitors, tourists, groups of schoolchildren and students, summer campers, cyclists to the fullest extent.

The accommodation offers an ideal stay primarily for school classes and bigger fellowships. There are altogether 11 rooms in the building, 10 of them with four, one with two beds. Every two rooms have a common bathroom and toilet.



Field trip

The field trip will be held on light terrain but it is advised to wear field clothing. Transport between sites will be provided by buses of the national park and the vehicles of the participants.

- Management of grasslands with grazing and mowing
- Synchronisation of management actions with the needs of breeding birds
- Restoration of wetlands in the Hanság region
- Conservation management of wet meadows and swamp meadows (6510, 7230, 6410)

May 5

- Management of forest clearings in lack of traditional use
- Management of wet and dry deciduous forests conflicts with farmers
- Synchronising social welfare functions and conservation requirements of forests
