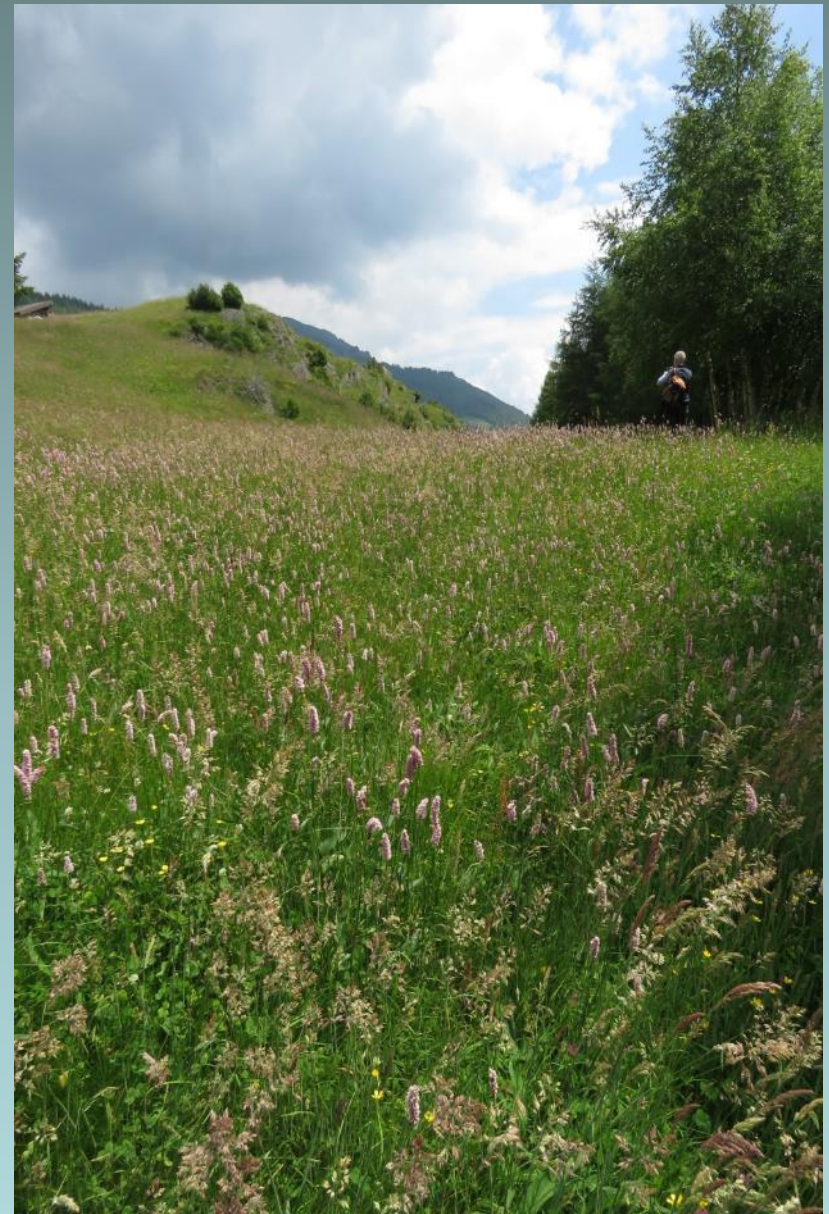

ONGOING PROJECT

Grazing on alpine pastures is needed to preserve Habitats
Sometimes dietary integration are given on pastures
Toward (an agro-environmental scheme?) a better pasture
management, a better and less expensive feed intake, more
authentic products.

NOT POSSIBLE DOING THIS BY OURSELVES...

- **CHANGINGS ARE VERY SLOW (but happens) – PATIENCE IS NEEDED, NEVER FORCE CHANGINGS – Try to find hidden energies in rural communities**
- **SOME FUNDING SCHEMES FIT POORLY TO REALITY sometimes they are too big, sometimes rules are too heavy**
- **MORE AMBITIOUS PROJECTS REQUIRE CORE COMPETENCIES THAT ARE NOT ALL WITHIN THE ADAMELLO PARK STAFF**
