


Transboundary Parks...following nature's design

WHO WE ARE

The EUROPARC Transboundary "Following Nature's Design" Programme and Certificate were developed to support a process of mutual understanding, often between countries where history may have created mutual distrust, or administrative barriers and develop management tools to enable greater cooperative management.

TransParcNet is the network created by the certified Transboundary Protected Areas that agreed to work together and exchange experiences and practices










SOME EXAMPLES OF WHAT WE DO

- Better approach to management and funding
- Possibility to harmonise management in TB areas
- Cooperation leads to better image = park and its work being valued

CHALLENGES

- Involve more local stakeholders (public and private)
- Making the activity more visible
- Expand and strengthen TransParcNet
- Promotion of Programme benefits
- Develop common projects

CHALLENGES

- Making more visible the possibility to develop common management of N2000 TB areas and to exchange experience on this topic
- Cooperate with other TB initiatives
- Develop synergies with other Federation's programme (such as Charter)
- Lack of financial resources to join programme
- Funding
