

## **OULANKA NATIONAL PARK**



- Established in 1956, enlarged in 1982 and 1989
- Land of flowing waters, rivers Oulankajoki and Kitkajoki
- 290 km<sup>2</sup>
- Around 200 000 visitors annually





# PAANAJÄRVI NATIONAL PARK



- Founded in 1992
- True wilderness and the diversity of lakes, rivers, forests and fells
- 1045 km<sup>2</sup>
- 5000-6000 visitors annually




