However, EUROPARC was happy to provide our members with the opportunity to learn, network and get ready for the future through this online event.

In Brussels, the upcoming months are important for the new future CAP (Common Agriculture Policy) and how to combine it with the EU Green Deal: in EP the vote is planned in October, and the Council will debate it under the German presidency. Additionally, EUROPARC is involved with the other organisations and members of the European Food Coalition, in the dialogue with European Institutions for the full implementation of the Farm to Fork Strategy in connection with the Biodiversity Strategy and CAP. Concerning the new EU Biodiversity Strategy, EUROPARC is working with other NGOs in the EHF (European Habitat Forum) and the EUROPARC Commission to elaborate criteria for the Protected Areas' targets in the Biodiversity Strategy.

We are also working hard on the schedule of <u>our webinars</u> for the upcoming months. We look forward to welcoming all of you online. Scroll down to see what is coming up! Within the framework of our webinars, we will also release new publications to continuously support the work of Protected Areas so "watch this space"!

Additionally, EUROPARC is continuously working on developing its new strategy. In the upcoming months we will analyse the data together with our consulting agency Dialogue Matters.

Training on Business Planning for Mediterranean Marine Protected Areas

This highly operational 4-day training course will be hosted by Brijuni National Park (Croatia) **from 7 to 10 December 2020**. In the event that the evolution of the epidemic situation and related constraints do not allow the organisation of the training on the planned dates, the selected participants will follow an online training course, rearranged in a succession of modules scheduled in January 2021. The training objectives are to understand the main concepts of business planning for MPAs and to autonomously use business planning tools. IUCN Global Stand for Nature-base Solutions Benchmarks for nature-based solutions to global challenges

In August IUCN, with whom EUROPARC has a Memorium of Understanding, published the first ever set of benchmarks for nature-based solutions to global challenges. The publication should help governments, business and civil society ensure the effectiveness of nature-based solutions and maximise their <u>potential to help address climate change</u>, <u>biodiversity loss</u> and other societal challenges on a global scale. 
