## COVID emergency triggered changes in tourism and visitors' patterns and behaviours

Some investigations at european level:

Survey launched by ALPARC (Network of Alpine Protected Areas) involving 18 alpine PAs from alpine countries (summer 2020)



- 1. What are the main factors for which tourists come in your park region?
- 2. Do you think that Covid19 leads to a rising demand for nature-based tourism and physical activity in preserved nature? Please explain.
- 3. How do you raise awareness for more sustainable outdoor sports activities?





### COVID emergency triggered changes in tourism and visitors' patterns and behaviours

Some investigations at local level:

### Survey launched by Ossola Protected Areas:

- interviews over 31 days (july september).
- 753 questionnaires randomly collected.
- general data (profile) + 17 questions.





















Data from local survey, july september, 2020, Ossola Protected Areas









### Which of the following initiatives should be offered to those who visit this area?

- On-site information about environment (notice boards, panels)
- Preparation of signaled tracks
- Control of the activities inside the protected area
- Information via web/social network
- Organization of guided tours with Naturalistic/Alpine Guides
- · Preparation of equipped rest areas
- None of the initiatives indicated above
- Regulation of the activity
- Holiday packages (e.g. excursion + sojourn/gastronomy, weekend/2 days packages, etc.)

### COVID emergency triggered changes in tourism and visitors' patterns and behaviours

### Some findings at european and at local level:

- Visitors searched for easy-to-reach areas, natural beauties, outdoor activities. **More local** visitors and less tourists from abroad.
- COVID emergency boosted the **demand for open spaces**, **outdoor activties and sports at local level**. PAs meet the rising demand for "natural" social distancing, safety and health.
- More "newcomers": slight awareness of environmental issues (one day tours, "hit and run").
- A widespread effort in **setting up/improving awareness raising campaigns** in order to cope with the situation.






### Complications in transboundary cooperation











### Complications in transboundary cooperation

- Some findings at european level:
- Less cross border exchanges?
- Higher pressure of visitors at local level?
- Programmes, projects and joint initiatives (e.g. joint planning) slowed down?
- Lower incomes from joint initatives/activities and for local operators?
- Lower impact of environmental education, training courses?
- COVID affects staff engagement, language issues, digital participation?
- ...back to normal or towards a NEW NORMAL?
