



IMPLEMENTATION OF THE 30% PAS TARGET

- Values of existing PAs to be identified and assessed
- Target all PAs, not just those only designated for conservation objectives
- New designations will be a crucial asset
- Cannot ignore challenges ahead: build ownership for the process
- Natura 2000 completion and effective implementation as a matter of priority
- Welcome priorities for urban/peri-urban areas


STRICTLY PROTECT AT LEAST A THIRD OF THE EU's PAs – 10%


Welcome the target and definition!

Non-intervention as primary approach

 Some specific management activities for restoration and conservation

- Not as new category of PA
- Do not underestimate implementation challenges
- Build understanding, support, ownership...
- Supporting investments for implementation and enforcement

EFFECTIVELY MANAGE ALL PROTECTED AREAS

- Management effectiveness crucial for next 10 years
- Designations (10%-30%) won't be enough
- EM: objectives, planning, resources, governance, communication, community engagement
- Not only "measuring tools"
- Develop capacity: new competences required
