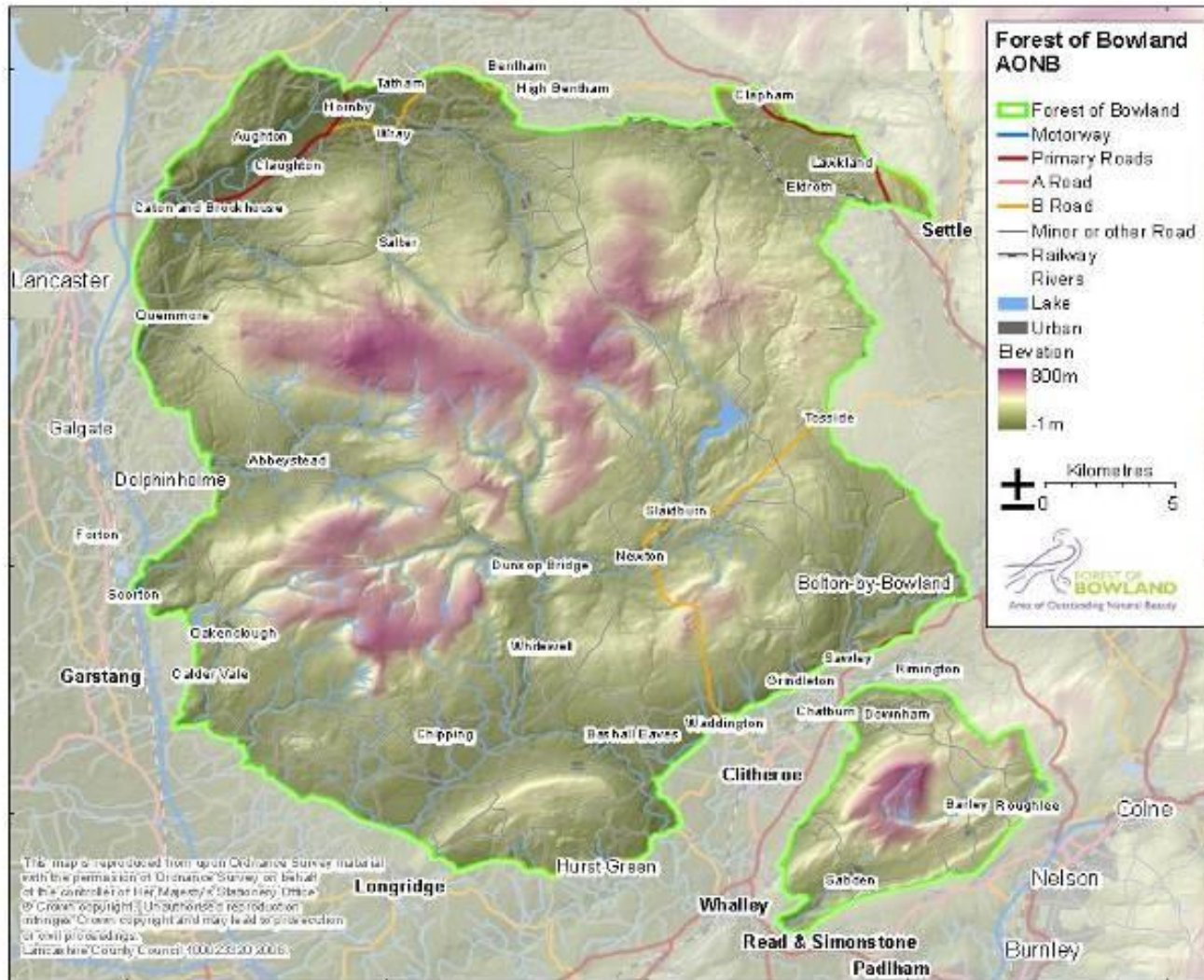




Forest of Bowland AONB

- One of 46 Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty in England, Wales & Northern Ireland
- 34 in England
- Cover 18% of the countryside





- Internationally important for its heather moorland, blanket bog, upland hay meadows and rare birds
- Covers an area of 810km²
- Highest point of the Bowland Fells 570m
- Almost 20% of area is designated for nature
- Approximately 16,000 people live within the boundary of the AONB
- Around 8 million people within 90 minutes travel time



- AONB Climate Change Adaptation Plan 2011, using modelling from UK Climate Impacts Programme (UKCIP)
- Vulnerable Habitats
 - Blanket bog (upland peat)
 - Upland hay meadows
- Our highest nature restoration priorities over the last decade

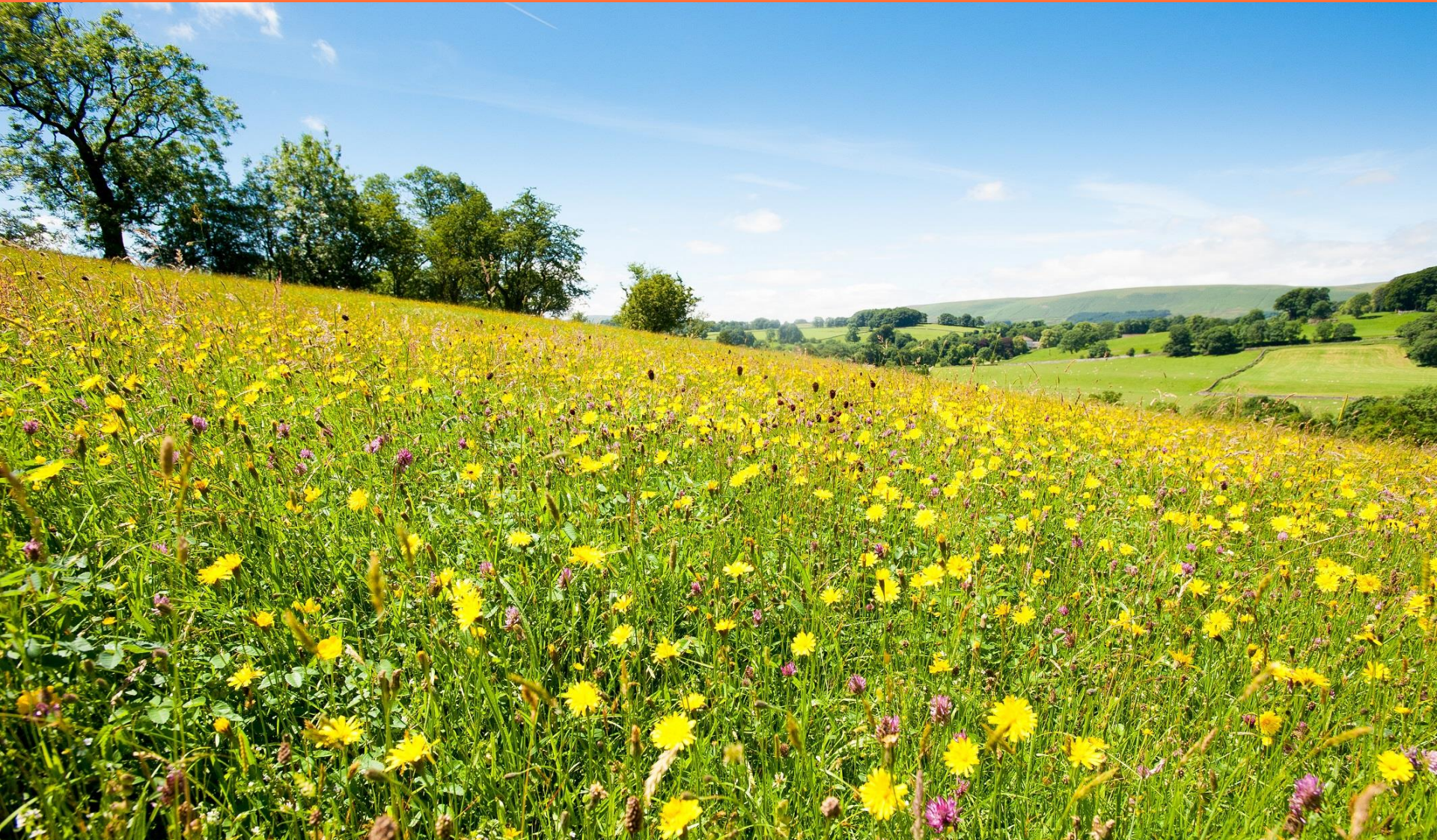
