

History of Pelagos

- November 1999: The **Pelagos Agreement** is signed.
- November 2001: Pelagos becomes the first and only International SPAMI
- February 2002: the Pelagos Agreement enters into force

The Sanctuary is:

- a precursor of the Maritime Spatial Planning (MSP);
- a **pilot area of Accobams** (Agreement on the Conservation of Cetaceans of the Black Sea, Mediterranean Sea and contiguous Atlantic area)

Objective

- **improving conservation** by assessing and managing the impact of humans on the species and habitat of marine mammals;
- **strengthening multilateral cooperation** in carrying out conservational activities and ensuring that each Party applies the provisions within their own territory.



Why this area?

• Originally the area was identified to be **particularly rich of pelagic** charismatic **cetacean species**: the **fin whale**, the **Cuvier's beaked whale**, the **Sperm whale**, the **Pilot whale**.








Broader importance

- The importance of this ecosystem is clearly ecologically broader and more complex to be able to sustain such diversity
 - >100 Marine Protected Areas,
 Marine Parks, and Natura 2000 sites
 of various sizes + 3 SPAMIs + 2 EBSAs









Binding measures

- All marine mammals protected by the laws of the Parties to the Agreement
- Ban of drifnets
- Motorboat racing regulated or prohibited
- Prohibition of seismic prospecting activities
- Obligation of anti-collision systems (FR)
- Intentional disturbance prohibited: every approach
 of the individuals to less than 100 meters is
 considered as intentional disturbance (FR)


Soft law measures

- Pelagos Partnership Charter
- Pelagos Ambassadors
- Code of Good Conduct
- Etc.



Pelagos Charter

- Outreach & conservation tool
- Extended and tailored to marine protected areas





Public awarness

- Protected areas are themselves powerful tools to rise environmental awareness.
- Marine mammals as charismatic species make environmental public awareness even easier.






Pelagos Ambassadors

- Outreach & partecipatory conservation tool
- > 700 members
- Adhere to and disseminate the Pelagos code of conduct









Legislation within Pelagos

Intentional disturbance prohibited (in France, every approach of the individuals to less than 100 meters is considered as intentional disturbance).

Pelagos Code of Conduct

- > 5 miles for the coast
- V < 10 knots
- D > 100 m
- $T = 30 \min (15 \min)$
- · Do not touch, feed or swim with cetaceans




Management Plan and Action Plan 2022-2027 New objectives & New methods

- New modus operandi = strenghtening the international collaboration between the Parties
- Enhance a partecipative governance;
- Creating Pelagos network of experts/stakeholders = Working Groups, partnerships, etc.;
- Shifting of the rational = from species to pressures;
- Creation of the "Pelagos Voluntary Fund";
- Efforts towards harmonization = procedures, governance, measures, etc.;
- Implementation of high priority themes, led by the Parties: "Pelagos fights against pollution" and "Pelagos Slow Travel" to mitigate the impacts of pollution of different sources and the ship strikes with large cetaceans.
- Implementation of mitigation measures;
- Partnerhips with IGOs, NGOs, Universities, territorial administrations, etc.;
- Mapping of the species and threats;
- Initial assessment of species and pressures;
