Learning from Finnish Youth LAGs




- We met up in February 2020 and discussed what we wanted to achieve as a group
- Covid limited travel and in person meetings
- We had several online meetings and did some projects on the side such as the Heritage Horizons Projects Advisory Board
- We attended EUROPARC 2020 online and took part in various workshops, including one on young people in rural areas
- We submitted some clips which were used in a CNPA climate change film on the pandemic in October 2020 and later created our own film to try to recruit new members

Minecraft

- We worked with the Planning Manager on a scale map of the Cairngorms which he had created on Minecraft
- The aim was to create a community or neighbourhood that met the aims of the national park
- This task was designed to encourage young people to interact with the national park and think about how they would protect and enhance the natural environment and make use of resources



The Cairngorms Youth LAG




- In November 2021 CYAT met to plan the fund
- They drafted an overview, application form, FQAs, scoring matrix and evaluation form
- The documents were reviewed and the Youth LAG fund was launched

Aims of the Youth LAG

 - Individuals £500 / groups £2500; under 30s; Cairngorms connection

- Contribute to delivering the aims of the EUROPARC Youth Manifesto
 - Officially adopted by the CNPA
- Meet the charitable aims and objectives of the Cairngorms Trust

Background and eligibility

The Cairngorms Youth Local Action Group (Youth LAG) is responsible for a fund of £15,000 to empower the youth in their living, learning and working within the Cairngorms National Park. The fund will promote young people's connection to nature and community and inspire environmental awareness to create positive change and take action to address biodiversity loss and climate change. We want to protect and conserve our environment and develop a deep nature connection that has positive impacts on health and well-being.

The fund is for:

- · People under the age of 30
- People who live within the Cairngorms National Park or to support activity with young people that will be delivered within the National Park
- · People and organisations that work directly with young people
- · Activity that works with local providers
- · People that promote inclusive activity with under-represented groups

The fund will support projects or activities that includes some or all of the following fund priorities:

- · Sustainability, biodiversity and addressing the climate emergency
- · Skills development
- · Inter-generational projects
- · Art, creativity and culture
- Nature connection
- Fun
- · Building community, networks and interactions between people
- · Inclusion and under-represented groups

Examples of what the fund will support include:

- Money for skills training e.g. Winter Skills, Mountain Leader, Art classes, Wild-life ID, Outdoor First Aid
- Money for equipment and kit, such as outdoor activities (e.g. tents, guidebooks, waterproofs, binoculars etc), creative materials (e.g. art materials and photography equipment etc), gardening and outdoor tools (e.g. moth traps, pond dipping, plants and trees, etc)
- · Events and activities that bring people together

Individuals can apply for up to £500.

Groups and organisations can apply for a maximum of £2500.

Funding cycle 2: 2022-23

- •Round 1: July 2022 March 2023
 - We received 40 applications, totalling £37,989
 - £20k in funding was offered across 21 successful applications, leaving £10K for round 2
 - 3 applications came from under 18s
 - KHS and GGS schools were not given funding this year to prioritise individual applications which tended to under-score on impact and legacy


Youth Artist in Residence



- Some members of the Youth LAG applied to the fund for money to run an artist residency
- The artist would be commissioned to create a piece of art focusing on one or more of these themes
 - -Sustainability, biodiversity and addressing the climate emergency
 - -Skills Development
 - -Inter-generational projects
 - -Art, creativity and culture
 - -Nature Connection
 - -Fun
 - -Building community, networks, and interactions between people
 - -Inclusion and underrepresented groups

First Youth Artist in Residence

- Rachael Horsburgh was chosen from the applicants
- Rachael stayed at Inshriach Bothy from 17th 24th March
- She described it as "A week of wild tranquility, all thanks to the Cairngorms Youth Action Team, which inspired artistic, creative, and self-empowered growth that I would not have achieved without this opportunity"
- She then decided to join CYAT



Second Youth Artist in Residence

- It was decided to run the residency again
- Applications opened in October
- Our youth artist was chosen in early November and the residency ran from 24th November - 1st December

Future aims

- Work with similar groups from across Scotland
- Run a climate camp in August
- Recruit more members and raise awareness of CYAT
- Review the EUROPARC Youth Manifesto
- Set up volunteering sessions within the Cairngorms
- Continue the Youth LAG Fund
