	The 2 co-chairs stay (at least one with experience) in office 2 years and can be re-elected. A revision of the Term of Reference will be done each 3 years, corresponding to the Council renewal.

What do you plan to do and achieve for the period to 2024

- To enlarge TransParcNet with at least 1 new TB park per year and to support TBPAs to renew
- To continue "mentoring" new possible members in formal and informal ways (parks that are similar, or in the same regions, or with which the members of the task force have relationships and collaborations)
- Organize one TransParcNet life meeting per year workshops and best practice of TB management and solving problems.
- Task force meetings with different themes 3 per year.
- Identify cross border problems of and for the members.
- At least 1 open webinar per year (EUROPARC webinars)
- At least 1 internal webinar per year only for TransParcNet members, devoted to specific topic of interest (e.i. European Grouping of Territorial Cooperation -EGTC)
- Continue to collaborate with EUROPARC Sections to promote the program at national/regional level with specific events and webinars in local languages (as done in French and Spanish)
- Sub-working groups active on topics specifically important for the network
- At least 1 project proposal presented
- Candidature of the TransParcNet to the European Citizen Award
- Visibility of the TransParcNet and of the Transboundary Program increased at European and international level.
 Possible participation on alliances (e.i. European Cross-Border Citizens' Alliance) and other networks
- Specific attention to cross-border Marine Protected Areas and evaluation on if and how to involve them in the program (meetings with managers, webinar)
