

NATURE: better management, investigations, actions.

PROTECTED AREAS: visibility, projects, opportunities.

STAFF: motivation, interculture, innovation, kowledges.

EUROPE: Building Europe on the ground

CHALLENGES about...

POLITICS: Political will. Unstability

LEGAL FRAMEWORK: Different legislative and administrative rules and background. Different protected areas category. Borders in not-Schengen area.

STAFF: Language barrier. Time.

PROTECTED AREAS: Lack of funds. Need of personal and institutional commitment

COMMUNITIES: Lack of mutual trust / sometime heavy historical memories



Transboundary Parks...following nature's design

The EUROPARC

"Transboundary Parks Programme: following Nature's design"

is a special **verification** and **certification** system

that aims to promote and facilitate transboundary cooperation between European Protected Areas

The Programme



- 14 EUROPARC Basic **Standards** for transboundary cooperation (Quality Criteria and Fields of Work, with indicators)
 - A **verification** process carried out by external verifiers (Field evaluation mission, assessment and recommendations)
 - The formal **certification** as "EUROPARC Transboundary Area" if the application was successful (Award Ceremony)
 - The **renewal** of the Certificate every 5 years

The **programme** is open to crossborders European Protected Areas that are **members** of EUROPARC

On the 30th anniversary of the Fall of the Berlin Wall we, the European Transboundary Parks highlight the need to re-enforce cooperation and mutual understanding in Europe, across frontiers.

Since its birth, EUROPARC's
Transboundary Parks Programme,
has embodied the spirit of the
Fall of the Berlin Wall, on the basis of
our day to day experience
collaborating in the management of a
shared biodiversity
despite our political borders.

Our network of protected areas is characterised by being one, close to the other- but separated by a border a virtual administrative, political and cultural wall - even in a now open Europe.



The experience of our history, our knowledge and values, led us to create a movement of active people, concretely co-operating and building projects to overcome barriers through the EUROPARC Transboundary Parks Programme: a true European project.

The inspiration derived from the Fall of the Wall is particularly evident given that most of our protected areas are located on the former Iron Curtain (now European Green Belt). Just looking at a map of Europe makes this very clear.

As equally evident is the energy and the will that the people involved in the Transboundary Programme put into the cooperation activities every day, driven by the pleasure of working together in once, long-time divided territories.

For these reasons and on this occasion,

we strongly declare our commitment for peace, dialogue and nature protection

and our availability to support, in the frame of our institutional goals and skills, any initiative aimed at fostering cooperation between European states within and beyond the European Union.
