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
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

Concretise

Set goals and timelines. Identify actions and responsibilities.

1980 führt Simone Veil auf dem Vorplatz des Europäischen Parlaments einen direkten Dialog mit den Landwirten, die in Straßburg zahlreich gegen die Gemeinsame Agrarpolitik demonstrieren

In 1980, Simone Veil spoke directly with farmers outside the European Parliament who had come to Strasbourg to demonstrate against the Common Agricultural Policy
