



Tirweddau Cymru Landscapes Wales is a partnership of the designated landscapes in Wales, working together to address key challenges including action on climate change and helping nature to recover.

Tirweddau Cymru Landscapes Wales is made up of the five AONBs in Wales: Anglesey, Clwydian Range and Dee Valley, Llyn Peninsula, Gower and Wye Valley. And the Welsh National Parks: Brecon Beacons National Park, Pembrokeshire Coast National Park and Snowdonia National Park Authorities.

Investing in our landscapes across Wales

Sustainable Landscapes, Sustainable Places is a Welsh Government capital fund for Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty and National Parks. It has provided over £8 million to support over 90 projects in the eight Welsh Designated Landscapes, who are working together as Tirweddau Cymru Landscapes Wales to deliver projects on key themes.

Between 2020 and 2022 the Fund has delivered:

29 Decarbonisation projects

including:

- Land purchase and management projects for carbon sequestration.
- 11 green building projects retrofitting buildings, renewable energy, and baseline reviews.
- 80 EV charge points and one eBike charging project.
- 8 EVs to replace end of life pool/warden vehicles.
- 2 collaborative carbon baseline and action plan projects.
- 6 projects replacing equipment with zero-emission electric alternatives.

11 Nature based solutions and nature recovery projects

including:

- Tree nursery equipped to propagate and provide local provenance, native tree stock for planting.
- Hedgerows and mature tree restoration and planting.
- Pioneering light reduction project to improve nocturnal biodiversity.
- 2 projects restoring peatland.
- 4 projects restoring and protecting habitats and key ecological sites.
- 2 projects improving woodlands and wood meadow for community use.

44 Sustainable tourism projects

including:


- 18 projects improving access and recreation opportunities, including improved footpaths and other routes.
- Masterplanning for more sustainable future transport to and within Designated Landscapes.
- 15 projects improving visitor and community amenities such as car parks and sustainable toilets.
- 3 projects improving key heritage and other visitor sites.

11 Resilient Communities and Covid recovery projects

including:

- 4 projects to create plans for improving local access to green spaces.
- 2 projects providing grants for community priorities.
- 2 projects updating technology to respond to new ways of working.

COPA1: SHAPING THE FUTURE OF YR WYDDFA THROUGH YOUTH-LED CLIMATE ACTION

First environmental project for young people in Eryri!

This exciting event is part of the Plastic Free Yr Wyddfa project, aiming to tackle single-use plastic pollution through the innovative ideas of the next generation.

Pupils from different age ranges were invited to submit video pitches on their 'Big Ideas' based on themes related to communication, policy, and innovation. Shortlisted groups will attend the inaugural Youth Climate Summit in September 2024 on the summit of Yr Wyddfa to pitch their ideas in incubator workshops. The winners from each category will then go on to turn their ideas into reality with a £1,500 development grant.
