



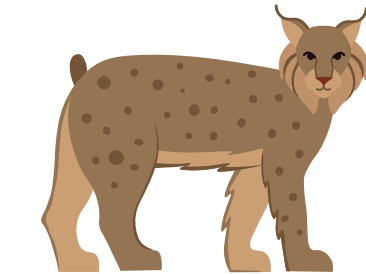
# Status of large carnivores in Europe

## They and their habitats are technically protected but ... **CURRENT THREATS:**

- Hunting pressure (legal and illegal).
- Habitat modification and loss (e.g. from agriculture, development, forestry).
- Habitat fragmentation (such as roads, veterinary fences) that hinders physical and genetic dispersal and cause roadkills.



# OVERARCHING SOLUTIONS

- Uphold the measures that have allowed populations to rebound, such as protection
- General habitat protection and restoration
- Support coexistence to avoid human-wildlife conflicts

- We are future decision-makers and teachers



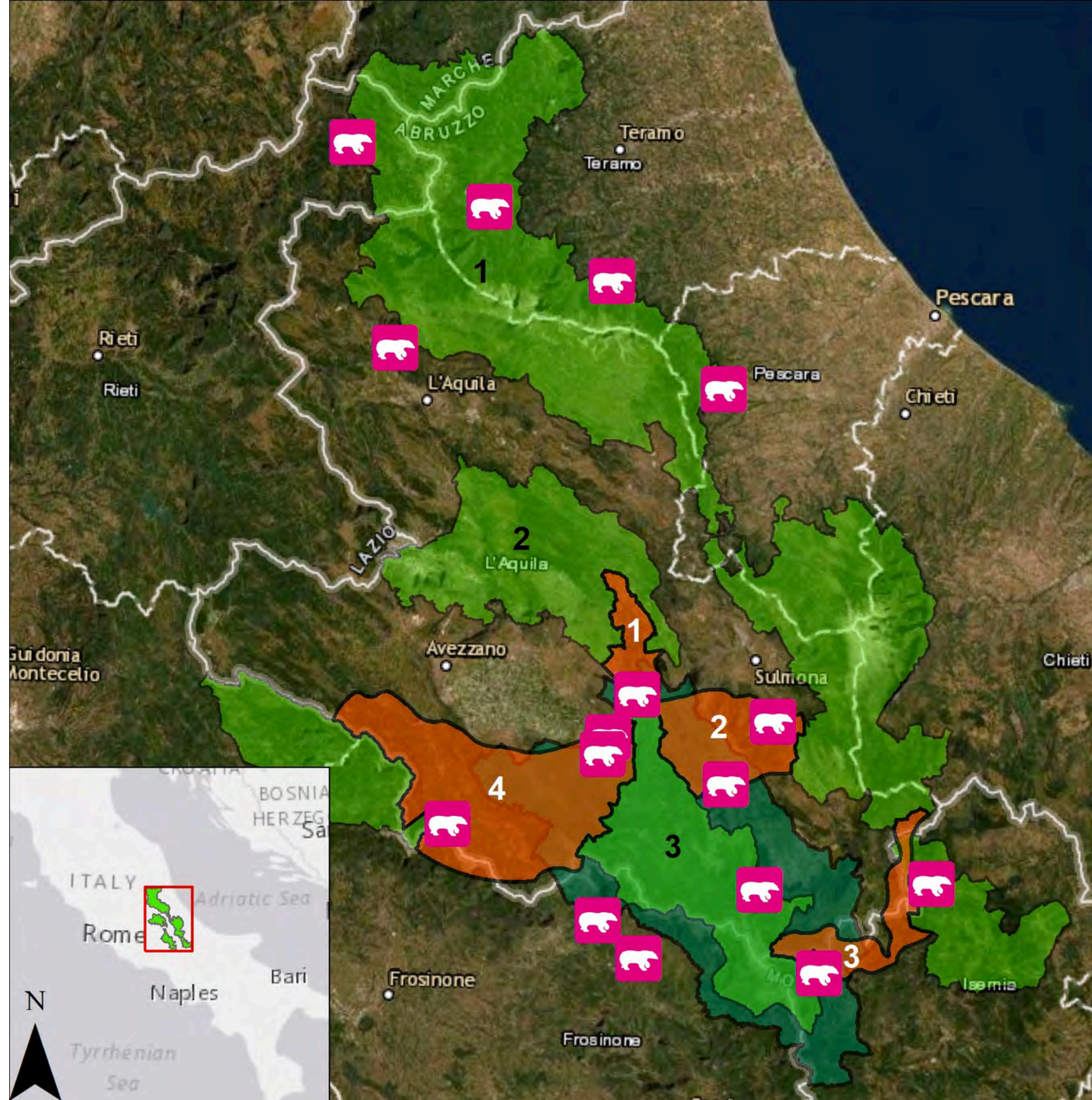

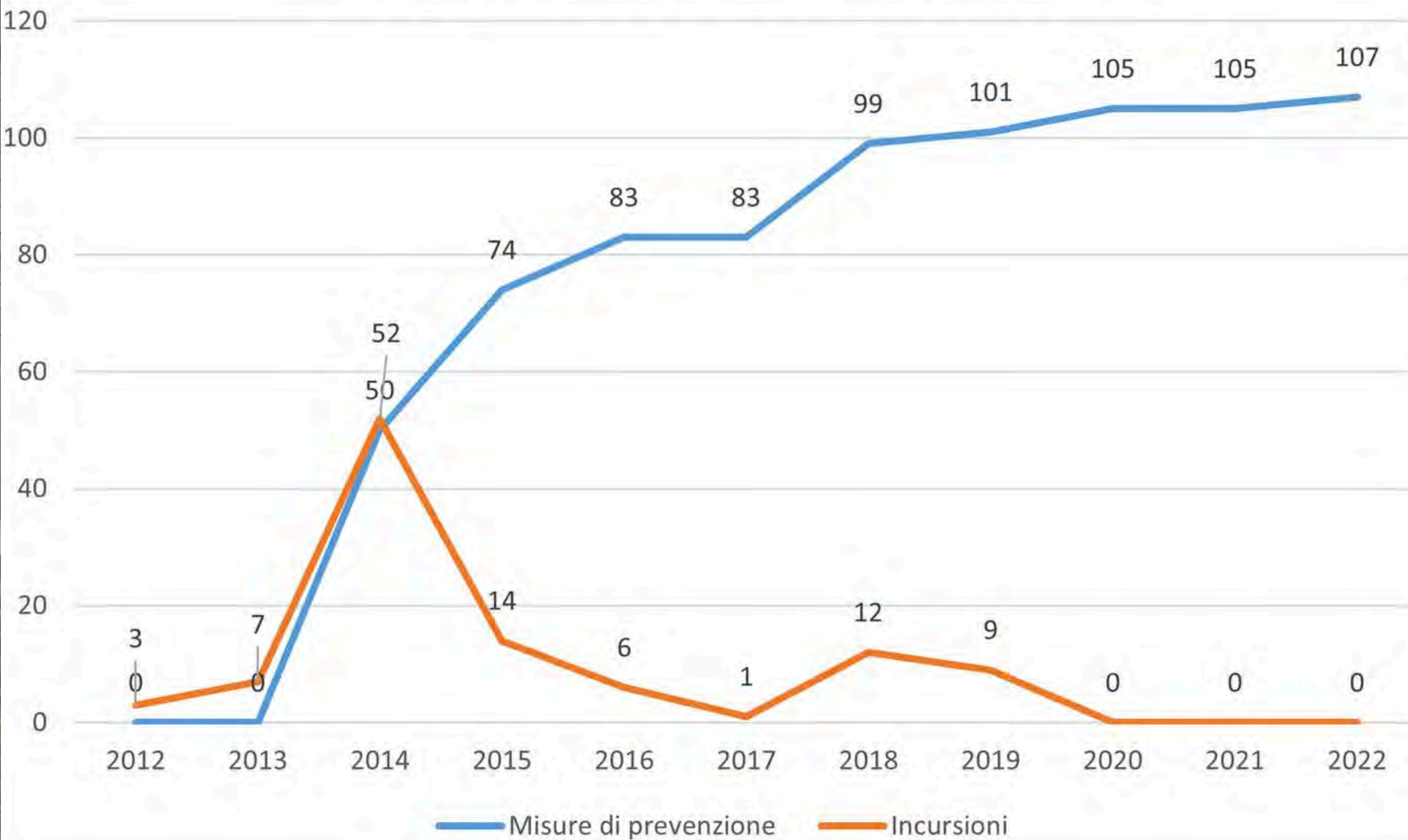
# Setting up predator-proof electric fences (beehives, farms, fruit orchards)
