RE-CAP - CMP OPEN STANDARDS


- To find out what works and what does not

- A common language & method, which supports and enables adaptation to changing circumstances, based on experience
- To learn & continuously grow nature conservation knowledge, based on shared wisdom and experience

- Need to improve learning by making lessons learnt more accessible ...



A COMMON LANGUAGE for a COMMON POLICY FRAMEWORK? – NATURA 2000

- Building on Eurosite Toolkit
- Allowing for more adaptive site management
- More evidence based, systematic learning







EUROSITE & FOS EPAM IN THE EUROPEAN CONTEXT

- Follows CMP logic
- European CMP Member: site management
- N2000 > 25,000 sites, 17% EU territory
- 20% have a management plan
- Quality disputed.
- Favourable conservation status not achieved
- NETWORK not achieved









EUROSITE & FOS EPAM IN THE EUROPEAN CONTEXT



- Reinventing the wheel
- Lack of knowledge what works, what doesn't
- Confusion of tongues
- Multiple systems
- No consensus on frameworks







EUROSITE & FOS EPAM IN THE EUROPEAN CONTEXT

- Open Standards in general apply
- No shockingly new things
- Learning & adaptation parts weak
- Comprehensive, well aligned, complete
- Visualisation helps
- We can improve how we harominze monitoring & learning

Emerging Coaches network

19 coaches from more than 10 different orgs

Leaders of Tomorrow

- MSc Bsc Students University of Eberswalde
- 2008: 50 students + 2 coaches
- 2009: 60 students + 2 coaches







BUILDING CAPACITY - WORKSHOPS

- To date 2 regional workshops have been held in Europe
 - Savonlinna, Finland, 2007
 - Tour du Valat, France, 2008
- Both hosted by a local organisation, but marketed by Eurosite and FOS
- In total, 70 people from 15 European countries, representing 20 site management organisations (including GOs, NGOs, POs) have attended these workshops
