January- February 2010

Overview.

With the creation of a new workplan in November 2009 for the 2010, this report corresponds to the objectives and activities agreed for 2010.

With only 2 months since the last council meeting this workplan update is therefore rather brief.

The following summaries the activities undertaken:

Internal Issues:

- The bookeeping situation has now been resolved, with the contracting of this to Nicole Haider. She will undertake all bookkeeping and produce the financial statements for the federation. She will work in German and English was outsourced. The legal challenge has now been resolved, and Sabine Schloegal will leave our employ in September, this has resulted in a substantial cost to the Federation in 2010.
- With the resignation of Richard Blackman as deputy Director, the office in Brussels will remain with one member of staff until further notice. To accelerate cost saving an agreement has been reached with the IUCN office AS such we will close the current office in the Mundo building and move to a new office within the IUCN building. This will result in savings for the Federation as well as enhance the working relations between our two organisations. The move will take place in the Summer.
- Office move to Regensburg has been greatly successful with official opening by the Mayor Hr Walberg, and excellent press coverage. We have also made some good contacts with local environmental organisations.
- Diana Gallrapp will take over the parks and benefits from Richard Blackman, Corneila Ehlers will tae over the Transboundary remit. We re discussing with EC how the charter administration can be eased and simplified. NO decision as yet of how the work of the BfN or STEPPA projects will be shared amongst staff..

Project development;

Following the planning session, the following project areas are under development

GRUNDTVIG - project application submitted

Youth in Action —a Junior Ranger/Volunteering project is being finalised with IRF. Possibly hosted by Scotland or Denmark. This will be submitted by June 2010

Sustainable development of the Mediterranean coastline though community involvement – this would be a focus on marine and marine junior ranger.

Seeking partners and meeting with WWF mediterrean. – application to MAVA foundation by will be submitted in July or August.

Agreement from BfN to find a charter related project. Discussing with EUROPARC consulting how we might deliver that as staff resources with the Directorate team are limited.

Considering submitting a LIFE + communication project. Staff time and resource becoming critical in preparation.





Finance Update

With the new bookkeeper in place, financial information is now readily available. Please see attached sheet.

This shows the income and expenditure for 2010sopread over 12 months. Cost are clearly not as uniform, but it can act as an early warning signal to identify ahead of time where there may be a cash shortfall.

The first column shows the full budget, the yellow 2nd column, with a 10% reduction in income the "working budget"

As indicated last year we are originally predicting a 54,000 E shortfall. Looking at the working budget this rises to 78425E, indicating a drop in membership fees of 10% and additional expenses encurred in the payment to Sabine Schloegal, the additional costs of the office move to Regensburg and costs of auditing.

However even with the saving from the deputy Directors salary and other cost saving measures, I am still predicting in the range of a 70K overspend.

This can be absorbed by the current reserves but will deplete them significantly...from 145K – 70K.

2011 however does look better. If <u>current</u> income levels can be sustained, we could be looking at a 70K positive result! Which SHOULD return the reserves to about their current value.

This also does not take into consideration any new income from project etc...

The priority for the Federation must be in achieving new, substantial projects!
