

## So ...what is a Dark-Sky Park?

It is more than just Dark! Officially described as:

A recognised park or other public land possessing exceptional starry skies and a natural noctural habitat where light pollution is mitigated and **natural darkness valued as an important, educational, cultural, scenic and natural resource**.

Sanctioned by International Dark-sky Association (est 1988), a USA based authority, with world wide recognition (UNESCO 2014).



## **Dark Sky Objectives**




- Creation of GOLD TIER Dark-sky Park in Mayo
- Develop Niche off-season Initiative for Astro-tourism & astrophotography, Archaeo-Astronomy, Sustainable Enviro-Friendly
- Preserve existing dark places without compromising safety
- Community Involvement eg Citizen Scientist, Stargazing courses
- Raise awareness of Impact of Light Pollution
- Connect with biodiversity & environmental objectives of Ballycroy National Park
- Target inclusion of light pollution in policy and planning
- Develop Dark Sky Network & collaborative model



Broadsheet Map of Populated areas (census 2011)


#### Night time aerial shot of Mayo Dark-sky Park




Land Boundaries of Ballycroy National Park & Wild Nephin




