Facts About Armenia



- Territory comparable to Belgium (30.000sq km)
- Population comparable to Wales (3mln)
- One of 25 biodiversity hotspots in the world – Caucasus region
 - 9 climate zones
 - Peaks higher than the Alps
 - 6,500 plant species
 - 131 mammals
 - 378 bird species

Caucasian Leopard

- <u>Status:</u> Endangered according to IUCN List of Threatened Species and Red Data book of Armenia
- <u>Habitat:</u> Spare forests, steppes, subalpine and alpine meadows of Southern Armenia
- <u>Requires:</u> Absence of snow, presence of cliffs and abundance of prey species
- Number: About 10 known individuals in Armenia
- Main threats: Poaching and habitat loss
- <u>Conservation:</u> State Reserves, National Parks and State Sanctuaries of Central and Southern Armenia





Ancient Times

- Revered as a symbol of power
- Found in prehistoric petroglyphs
- Medieval rock carvings
- Used in heraldry








Soviet Period (1920-1980s)

- Seen as a threat to farms and livestock
- Government rewards to hunters for killing leopards
- Leopard population sharply declined
- Included in Red Data Book of Armenia in 1987





Independent Armenia

- Situation did not improve after Independence
- Last known leopard was killed by poachers in 1999 in Khosrov State Forest Reserve





2002

- Leopard Conservation Project Launched by WWF Caucasus PO
- Improve capacity of protected areas
- Enhance protection of prey species
- No known signs of leopards





2006

 WWF Armenia registered as a branch of WWF International

More protected areas planned and created

First leopard captured on a camera trap





2017

- Caucasian Leopard Awareness Raising Campaign launched
 - ARLOOPA Augmented Reality campaign
 - "Take a photo with the Leopard" contest launched


2018


- Over 300 photos posted on social media

- Grand Prize: Mountain Bike









Outcomes during the campaign
