



26% of N2K is covered by national categories of PAs



Conservation and protection rule book

- Bylaw adopted by the responsible minister
- Legally binding for all area stakeholders

mutually compatible with the aim of long-term conservation of nature

 Land use plan highlighting the future needs for construction (buildings, infrastructure...)

- Long term work plan for Pl
- Assessment of the conditions in PA, long term objectives, activities and indicators

 Regulation and/or ban of different human activities in the specific PA (limits for visitation, noentry etc.)

multiple designation = one plan

segments of PA management

- \rightarrow Conservation of natural values (bio and geo diversity)
- → Sustainability of natural resources usage *if appropriate*
- \rightarrow Conservation and protection of cultural and traditional values
- \rightarrow Visitor management, interpretation and education
- \rightarrow Cooperation with local community And other...



Exsisting and future management mlans

- Conservation objectives and measures incorporated in 5 management plans of national and nature parks and in development for 6 (relation tables with a puppose to check if Natura 2000 managlement is covered)
- Recommendation in "National guidelines for management planning in protected areas and/or Natura 2000 sites" (soon available in English)
- New project "The development of a framework for management of the ecological network Natura 2000 in Croatia"
