



- Support transboundary conservation initiatives through improved knowledge management, networking and capacity building






Training module on TBC


- Draws on the IUCN WCPA TBC Guidelines

- Developed in partnership with the German Federal Agency for Nature Conservation (BfN)







TBC SG's advisory role



- Provide advice on TBC establishment, management and process to planners and managers
- Develop statements and policy recommendations of global and regional importance (e.g. A Statement on Transboundary Conservation for Biodiversity and Peace, CBD COP12; Promise of Sydney – Governance Stream, WPC, Sydney, 2014, Razor wire and nature in Europe, 2015)
- Evaluate transboundary UNESCO World Heritage nominations (e.g. Dauria Landscapes, Russia/Mongolia, 2014)
- World Heritage Conservation Outlook Assessment
- Convene international workshops and events (e.g. International workshop, Thayatal NP, 2013; Best Practice Guidelines' pre-launch, WPC Sydney, 2014; Governance of TBCAs, Hands across Borders, USA/Canada 2016)

Test and improve the diagnostic tool to assess the feasibility for TBC

Support implementation of a variety of formal and informal models of TBC governance
